# Rules: 1968 CQ World-Wide DX Contest

# October 26-27 & November 23-24

#### CONTEST PERIOD

Phone: Oct. 26-27, C. W.: Nov.23-24. The contest is always held on the last full weeknd of October and November.

## I. OBJECTIVE

The object of the contest is for Amateurs around he world to contact as many other Amateurs in as nany different Zones and Countries as they can luring the 48-hour contest period.

#### II. BANDS

All Amateur bands, 10 thru 160 meters.

#### V. TYPE OF COMPETITION

- 1. Single Operator.
  - a. Single Band.
  - b.All Band.
- 2. Multi-Operator. (all-band operation only)
- a. Single Transmitter. (Only one signal permitted)
- b.Multi-Transmitter. (Only one signal per band permitted)

## Y. NUMBER EXCHANGE

- 1. Phone: 4 numbers, RS report plus Zone umber. (i.e.-5805)
- 2. C.W.: 5 numbers, RST report plus Zone umbe**r. (i.e.-58905)**

#### VI. MULTIPLIER

Two types of multipliers will be used:

- 1. A multiplier of one (1) for each different one contacted on each band.
- 2. A multiplier of one (1) for each different ountry contacted on each band.

Stations are permitted to contact their own

ountry and Zone for multiplier credit.

The CQ Zone Map, DXCC country list, WAE ountry list and WAC continental boundries are he standards.

#### /II. POINTS:

- 1. Contacts between stations on different contients are worth three (3) points.
- 2. Contacts between stations on the same contient but different countries are worth one (1) oint.

(Exception: Contacts between stations within he North American continental boundries will ount two (2) points. This applies to N.A. only)

3. Contacts between stations in the same counry are permitted for Zone or Country multiplier redit but have Zero (0) point value.

Only one contact with the same station on the

ame band is permitted.

# VIII. SCORING

All stations: The final score is the result of the total QSO points multiplied by the sum of your Zone and Country multipliers.

Example: 1000 QSO points X 100 multiplier (30 Zones + 70 countries) = 100,000 (final score).


#### IX. AWARDS

First place certificates will be awarded in each category listed under Sec. IV.

- 1. In every participating country.
- 2. In each call area of the United States, Canada, Australia and Asiatic USSR.

All scores will be published. To be eligible for an award a Single-operator station must show a minimum of 12 hours of operation. Multi-operator stations must operate a minimum of 24 hours. A single-band log is eligible for a single-band award only. If a log contains more than one band it will be judged as an all-band entry, unless specified otherwise.

In countries or sections where the returns justify, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be made.

There are no "three year" restrictions on the winning of any CQ plaque, including Club awar

#### XI. CLUB COMPETITION

A handsome plaque will be awarded to the Clusubmitting the highest aggregate score of the phonand c.w. scores submitted by its member (Donated by CQ)

- 1. The club must be a local group and can not be a national body.
- 2. Participation is limited to active clumembers operating within local geographic are (except for DX-peditions especially organized for operation during the contest and manned by clumembers).
- 3. To be eligible for an award a minimum of logs must be received and an officer of the club musubmit a list of participating members and the scores, both phone and c.w.
- 4. Each participating member must clearly ind cate the name of his club on his Summary sheet.

# XII. LOGINSTRUCTIONS

- 1. All times must be kept in GMT.
- 2. Use a separate log for each band.
- 3. Indicate Zone and Country multipliers only the FIRST TIME they are contacted on each band
- 4. Logs must be checked for duplicate contact correct QSO points and multipliers, and recopie logs must be in their original form, with correction clearly shown.
- 5. Each entry must be accompanied by a Sun mary Sheet showing all scoring information, the category of competition, the contestant's name an address in BLOCK LETTERS, and signed declaration that all contest rules and regulations for amateur radio in the country have been observed.
- 6. Official log and summary sheets and Zon maps are available from CQ. A large self-addresse envelope with sufficient postage or IRCs must accompany your request.

If official forms are not available you can mak up your own by following the attached sample, wit 40 contacts to the page on 8½ x 11 inch paper.

#### XIII. DISQUALIFICATION

Violation of amateur radio regulations in the country of the contestant, or the rules of the contest; unsportsmanlike conduct, taking credit for incorrect QSOs or multipliers, or duplicate contact in excess of 3% of the total made will be deeme sufficient cause for disqualification.

Actions and decisions of the Committee are of ficial and final.

#### XIV. DEADLINE

All entries must be postmarked NO LATER that December 1, 1968 for the Phone section and January 15, 1969 for the C.W. section. In rare isolate areas the deadline will be made more flexible. Log go to:
